Erythema infectiosum or fifth disease is one of several possible manifestations of infection by parvovirus B19. The name "fifth disease" comes from its place on the standard list of rash-causing childhood diseases, which also includes measles (first), scarlet fever (second), rubella (third), Dukes' disease (fourth, but is no longer widely accepted as distinct), and roseola (sixth).

Kauffmann first proposed the genus name *Providencia* in 1951, referring to a group of organisms studied by Stuart and colleagues at Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island. By 1983, the 4 species in the *Providencia* genus at that time were fully differentiated with DNA hybridization and urea hydrolyzation. In 1986, *Providencia heimbachae* was the fifth species discovered.

Strictly inherited through the maternal lineage, human mtDNA contains only 37 genes, which encode 13 polypeptides, all core subunits of RC complexes I, III, IV, and V, and the RNA necessary for mtDNA translation, namely 2 rRNAs (12S and 16S) and 22 tRNAs. Nuclear genes encode the remaining ~ 70 OXPHOS components, and all other proteins required for mitochondrial metabolism and maintenance ...

Bleeding disorders may arise from problems with platelets, either from a low count in the blood or from dysfunctional platelets. A CBC, which includes a platelet count, may reveal a low number while platelet function tests may indicate that dysfunctional platelets are present.
